DIY Natural Green Cleaners

All Purpose Cleaner



Mix together in a spray bottle. (Please note: Mixing vinegar and baking soda, will cause the solution to foam up, so pour slowly.) Spray surface and wipe clean with a cloth.

Disinfecting Spray



Mix together in a spray bottle. Spray surface and wipe clean with a cloth.

Fabric Softener



Use 1 Cup during the rinse cycle. (Please note: Mixing vinegar and baking soda, will cause the solution to foam up, so pour slowly.)

Glass Cleaner



Mix together in a spray bottle. Spray surface and wipe clean with a microfiber cloth.

Toilet Cleaner



Combine ingredients into a spray bottle. (Please note: Mixing vinegar and baking soda, will cause the solution to foam up, so pour slowly.) Spray on toilet bowl and allow mixture to sit for a few minutes. Sprinkle more baking soda inside the toilet if needed. Scrub with a brush and flush when complete.

Bath and Shower Spray



Mix all ingredients together in a spray bottle. Spray surface and wipe clean. Use weekly to avoid soap scum build up.

Oven Cleaning



Mix baking soda and salt together. Spray surface with water and sprinkle on dry ingredients. Spray the oven again with water. Leave overnight. The next morning wipe out the oven and wash with hot soapy water.

Scouring Powder



Combine dry ingredients in a jar. Wet surface with water and sprinkle on your scouring powder. Leave on for 5 minutes then scrub clean with a brush or damp cloth.

Carpet Stain Remover



Rub light carpet stains with a mixture of 2 tablespoons salt dissolved in 1/2 cup white vinegar (add 2 tablespoons borax for larger darker stains). Let the solution dry and then vacuum.

Air Freshener Spray



Add water and baking soda to a spray bottle. Mix until baking soda is dissolved. Add in 10-20 drops of Tea Tree Essential oil. Mist around room for a natural and fresh scent.
